Important Financial Information:

The United States Customs and Immigration Services (USCIS) requires that international students document adequate financial resources to cover the full cost of their tuition, fees, living expenses, health insurance, books/supplies and personal costs for the duration of their stay in the United States, in order to apply for a visa to study in the USA. Students must at least verify adequate resources to fund these costs for the first year before the University can issue the forms necessary to apply for a student visa. The UMF website for international admission has an estimated budget that shows the breakdown of all of these costs and provides a total of estimated expenses for the year. You must submit your original financial documentation along with this form directly to UMF Admission Office, 246 Main Street, Farmington, Maine 04938, USA. **Do not send the financial document with your admission application to the shared processing center.**

All sources of support that you submit must be:

- ✓Original – not photocopies, scanned copies or faxes
- ✓Shown in US dollars
- ✓No more than one year old
- ✓Written in English
- ✓Prepared for the University of Maine Farmington

You should keep a second set of the same documents to present to the US embassy when you request your visa to study in the USA.
